Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord - Cycle B

Liturgical Jottings Epiphany in East & West

The Epiphany celebrates, in the Western churches, the adoration of the Magi from the East as the story of the revelation of the mystery of God's saving will (Eph 1:9) as embracing Gentiles as well as Jews. In the Eastern churches Christmas (January 6, an ancient date for the winter solstice) commemorates the birth of Christ and the homage of the Magi, while Epiphany marks Christ's baptism. The mystery of Christ as one sent by the Father in the Spirit to all nations and races and the essentially missionary character of the church are found in this feast. The Magi's following of the star to Christ has always expressed the longing of sages and philosophers for the fullness of truth, which only is found in full surrender to God in Christ, the Wisdom of God. The feast for Western Christians is a reminder as well a fount of the riches of worship, theology and spirituality which the Eastern churches bring to the catholica.

Looking at the Readings

Isaiah passage today gives a few "epiphany moments": Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has com; Lift up your eyes and look round; your heart throbbing and full. The words of the prophet are not just words of Salvation for God's chosen people but for all peoples, nations and rulers. Extending the insights from this Old Testament text to our present day we are able to confess: "Christ brings salvation not just to us, to those who come to our church, but to the whole world – to all those grumpy, depressed, selfish, worried, suffering, disadvantaged people we meet in the street, most directly to Christians of every kind, but also to those who have not yet found Jesus. The Epiphany is the time when Jesus 'went public', symbolised by the coming of the Wise Men from the East." *(Henry Wansbrough, Universalis commentary)*

A second prophet is quoted in today's Gospel by Matthew. The Prophet Micah, born in Bethlehem, spoke well of his birthplace and added: "for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel." Though Micah's actual words were not shepherd my people but "rule over Israel" (Micah 5:2). Matthew has "updated" the prophet's words and interpreted them to describe Jesus' mission for all peoples.

Definitions of Epiphany

This Greek word means manifestation applied particularly to the event in Matthew's Gospel of the visit of the Magi (wise men) to the infant Jesus. Christ is revealed to the Gentiles as Lord and Saviour. Some dictionaries include epiphany in a figurative sense meaning a sudden revelation, an "Aha!" moment.



I am Fr. Uday Kumar Marneni ALCP/OSS. I was born on 24th March 1981 and since then I grew up in my village (a small village of 300 Catholic families) Bhimanapally Kammagudem



in the Diocese of Nalgonda, in the state of Telangana, India. I am the youngest child to my late parents, Roman and Jathruthamma; I have an older sister and an older brother. My brother died four years ago.

My family was a traditional Catholic family. I did my schooling in Catholic Institutions. I was inspired to religious life by my cousins, who are religious sisters. I observed their faithful service in different fields, pastoral, medical, educational and social. They guided me to choose this way of life. Meanwhile, as years passed when I was in the seminary, I felt more than ever, the call to vocation that God had planned for me.

I was ordained a Roman Catholic Priest on 14 May 2011 for the Apostolic Life Community of Priests in the Opus Spiritus Sancti (ALCP/OSS).

Priesthood, for me, is challenging and rewarding. Being a priest has given me the privilege of getting to know people well and of being part of their lives in joyful and painful times. I hope to be a part of your community soon to be one of you to share the Word of God and Break the Bread of Life.
