Liturgical JottingsThe Fraction Rite

We hear at the end of the gospel passage today: "That they had recognised him at the breaking of bread." In New Testament times the Eucharistic celebration was often called "the Breaking of the Bread". This expression was taken both from the Last Supper and the meal at Emmaus where Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it and gave to the disciples. In the old Missal, this action was titled the Breaking of the Bread and in the new (2010) it is simply a rubric: "if the fraction is prolonged "Lamb of God" repeated. This is indicative of changes over the centuries, the fraction rite was sometimes seen as merely functionary and at other times quite symbolic. Theodore of Mopsuestia (d 428) explained the rite as Christ "breaking himself so that all may receive, as at the Last Supper and in several appearances after his resurrection.

Looking at the Gospels

The Easter post-catechumenate instruction continues. Today we reflect on life as a journey. This theme expresses well the fact that life is not static, but is a movement from one point to another. Actually, we do not so much make the journey as we join one that is already in progress. Nor are we alone on it. We have companions who share their encouragement and support, their talents and insight. Like the two disciples travelling to Emmaus, we have certain expectations which Jesus does not seem to fulfil. They did not realise that through his death he had accomplished everything. They did not realise that the Risen Lord himself was their travelling companion.

As with them, so with us. We may not see the extraordinary in the ordinary. We may not see the hand of God in our lives. Perhaps we need someone to interpret for us both the tradition and the events of life. Despite appearances, something is happening beneath what we are able to observe. God is at work beneath and within our lives. Once we realise who this unique travelling companion really is, our hearts too will burn within us, our eyes too will be opened, and we too will look at life with the assurance of faith. Easter faith will transform our disillusionment into missionary zeal. Some of us may be called upon to give public witness, as did Peter. Most will preach with the example of our lives. All can enter this mystery as we recognise him in the breaking of the bread. © Dianne Bergant CSA

Pope Francis Easter Vigil Homily

The women leave the tomb behind and run to the disciples to proclaim a change of course: Jesus is risen and awaits them in Galilee. Those women experienced Easter as a Pasch, a passage. They are to set out immediately to reach a destination, Galilee. There they will meet the Risen Lord. The resurrection of the hearts of the disciples passes through Galilee. Let us enter into this journey of the disciples from the tomb to Galilee. Let us ask ourselves today, brothers and sisters: what does it mean to go to Galilee? Two things: to leave the enclosure of the Upper Room and go to the land of the Gentiles, to come forth from hiding and to open themselves up to mission, to leave fear behind and to set out for the future. Secondly it is a return to the origins, for it was precisely in Galilee that everything began. There the Lord had met and first called the disciples. So, to go to Galilee means to return to the grace of the beginnings, to regain the memory that regenerates hope, the "memory of the future" bestowed on us by the Risen One. (Abridged part 2)


FIRST SANDHURST MISSION AND PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING:


