Focus on the Readings In many ways the Exodus story of the bread from heaven is very similar to

shown through the overabundance of food, but total dependence on God. The bread comes from heaven, not merely because the food seems to come down from the sky, but because it comes from God. The restriction about collecting it was meant to emphasise this point. Our survival is in God's hands, not ours. Jesus insists that he is the true bread from heaven; he is the real basis of our survival. The people followed him because they saw him as a source of bread; they did not realise that he is really the source of life. If we fill ourselves with all that the world provides as nourishment we will still hunger. Only faith in Jesus can satisfy our deepest hungers, and we will not be able to survive apart

last Sunday's accounts. However, the focus today is not divine prodigality

Acceptance of Jesus as the source of our life and the very nourishment of our spirits effects a total transformation in us. We will no longer be content to live with full bellies but empty minds. We will put aside our old selves steeped in ignorance and self-interest and put on a new self, created in his image. Having fed on the bread from heaven, we will be mysteriously transformed into it. His teaching will renew the spirit of our minds. As a result, we will be able to launch out into a way of living that witnesses to our new understanding, our



The Word of the Lord

And when Christ says: whoever does not eat my flesh and drink my blood (Jn 6:53), even though these words can also be understood of the Eucharistic Mystery, Christ's body and blood are really the word of Scripture, God's teaching. When we approach the Eucharistic Mystery, if a crumb falls to the ground we are troubled. Yet when we are listening to the word of God, and God's Word and Christ's flesh and blood are being poured into our ears yet we pay no heed, what great peril should we not feel?" 
