Liturgical JottingsEucharistic Prayer part 6 Intercessions

"The Intercessions in the Eucharistic Prayers express the fact that the Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the whole Church, of both heaven and of earth, and that the oblation is made for her and for all her members, living and dead, who are called to participate in the redemption and salvation purchased by the Body and Blood of Christ." GIRM 79g

The placement, wording and length of the intercessions vary in each of the ten Eucharistic prayers in the Roman Missal. The third Eucharistic Prayer includes intercession for the peace and salvation of all world, the pilgrim Church, the Pope and Bishops, all the clergy, the entire people and all God's children scattered throughout the world and finally for our departed brothers and sisters.

Looking at the Readings

The liturgy of the word opens with Isaiah's image of the Day of the Lord when all will be fulfilled. People will gather in the presence of God for a banquet that is more magnificent than any royal banquet or wedding feast. All suffering, mourning and sorrows will also end. We understand why this reading is also popular for funerals for it offers a vision of heaven with the best of everything.

The responsorial psalm (also used at funerals) complements the readings. The response also reinforces this sense: "I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life." We are invited into God's presence and enjoy his comfort and great largess.

The Gospel is the third parable in a sequence addressed to the chiefs priests and the elders of the people (The two sons, Matt 21:28-32, 26th Sunday; the landowner and the wicked tenants Matt 21:33-43, 27th Sunday; the wedding feast and the guest not dressed appropriately, Matt 22:1-14, 28th Sunday that is today). We should not fall into the trap and say those nasty people, we know better and we behave correctly. Yet Jesus' words are still relevant to people today. We are God's holy people, we are baptised and participate in the church's mission and worship. Can these words of warning to the leaders apply to us today?

All types of people are invited to the feast God has prepared. Many refuse to listen and accept. There is the odd one who says "Yes" but refuses to change his old habits. God is offering a lot, asking little and ready to help those in need.

THE MEANING AND PURPOSE OF THE MESSAGE STICK

For too long the indigenous people of this country have been left on the margins of our society, and sadly this has often been true of the Church as well. The installation of the Message Stick in Catholic parishes across Australia, acknowledges the wrongs of the past and highlights the special place that Aboriginal people occupy in the Church.

For thousands of years the Aboriginal People used the message stick as a way of communicating across country. Symbols or markings were engraved or painted to tell of Sacred Ceremonies, asking permission to cross the country of another tribe with different totems and lore. Today the Aboriginal Catholics carry the Message Stick with the Bible, symbolising the respect for cultural differences when spreading the Good News.

The Message Stick in the liturgical context, made its appearance in 1993, at the 20th anniversary of the first National Aboriginal Mass, which had been celebrated in Melbourne in 1973 at the time of the Eucharistic Congress.

During the Gospel procession the Message Stick was carried with great pride, alongside the book containing the Christian Word. This was a powerful symbolic gesture manifesting the willingness of both cultures to accept the Word and the coming together of peoples of different cultures to worship the Creator. On Aboriginal Sunday, July 5th, 1998, the Message Stick was installed in St Patrick's Cathedral. In the twenty-five years since, message sticks have been instated in Catholic parishes across Australia.

The Message Stick will continue to touch and heal the hearts of all who hear and believe the message of this story. The Church – the people of God – by accepting it, have taken an important step forward on our journey together toward reconciliation.
