

Liturgical Jottings Blessings 1 - Advent Wreath

The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of the Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before. The blessing may be celebrated during Mass. a celebration of the word of God, or Evening Prayer. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family; the shorter rite may appropriately be used for this purpose. Book of Blessings nn. 1509, 1514.

Looking at the Readings

Darkness in the scriptures symbolises absence, wrongdoing, the power of evil. Thievery and deceit are perpetrated during the night under the cover of darkness where lighting is minimal or non-existent. Nowadays we have expressions like daylight robbery and committed in broad da ylight to describe daring crimes hitherto unheard of. Not so then. Hence Jesus use of such expressions as: "stay awake" repeated four times in today's Gospel (Mark 13:33,34,35,37). Day and night we wait for the coming of God. Advent is the liturgical season we particularly wait for our God. We must overcome the urge to sleep, a metaphor for wandering from our Christian calling to be at prayer, service and readiness.

The Prophet Isaiah introduces a double theme of waiting for the coming of God. God awaits our return to him and we await his return to us. We have the urgency and drama expressed in verse 64:1 "Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down!" It is like a prayer (see below) especially for Christians who recognise the first coming of God at Christmas and the second coming at the end of time. Isaiah prays on behalf of and with the people for God to come and forgive our sins and restore us to our original holiness. He prays with love, addressing God as Father (63:16, 64:8) and presenting a wonderful image: "Lord, you are our Father; we the clay, you the potter, we are all the work of your hand.

Advent Prayer

Rend the heavens and come down, O God of all the ages! Rouse us from sleep, deliver us from our heedless ways, and form us into a watchful people, that, at the advent of your Son, he may find us doing what is right, mindful of all you command. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, whose coming is certain, whose day draws near. Amen.

Advent Customs: St Nicholas Day

In the Low Countries (Europe) St. Nicholas Day (6 November) is a time when children leave out their "polished" shoes the night before and find in them special cookies, chocolates or oranges in the morning. Oranges and chocolate coins are common treats that represent St. Nicholas's legendary rescue of three impoverished girls by paying their marriage dowries with gold. Candy canes, which have the shape of a bishop's crosier, are also given.
