Liturgical Jottings

Lectionary Translations

For more than 50 years the Lectionary (book of readings) for the Catholic Church in Australia has used the Jerusalem Bible (JB) translation. Last year the Australian and New Zealand Bishops' Conferences have approved the adoption of the "Revised New Jerusalem Bible". The texts include greater accuracy while maintaining its readability, especially when proclaimed aloud in liturgies. The translation is also noted for genderinclusive language and poetic style. The translation of the psalms is taken from the New Grail Psalter (2010). Our current Lectionary uses the Grail Psalms (1963); both are noted for great ease to chant and to proclaim. An example of the textual change is seen in the Beatitudes (Matt 5:1-12) from "Happy are the poor in spirit" to "Blessed are the poor in spirit". The concerns of the 1960's with a proclivity for colloquialisms have shifted now towards a nobler and more accurate translation.

Focus on the Gospel

The three readings have a common thread: God chooses and blesses the humble and lowly people (Zeph), the thoughts and values of a world are far from the values of the poor, weak and holy (1 Cor) and finally in the Gospel Jesus teaches his disciple and the great crowd of followers that they are happy and blessed because they are living the values founded by God. The Sermon on the Mount causes the listeners to compare and reflect on two sets of opposing values. The worldly values of the rich, the strong, the powerful and the complacent to the values of a true Godly person that lives poverty, humility, peace, justice and even persecution now and in the future.

Responsorial Psalm

Usually the Responsorial Psalms, which are between the first and second readings, are taken from the Book of Psalms. Occasionally they are Old Testament canticles or even from the Gospel, e.g. Luke 1:46-54, Mary's song of praise (Advent Sunday 3B). Today Ps 145(146):6-10 has the response from today's Gospel: "Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs!" This psalm provides both a summary of the three readings and offers praise to God who is the initiator of all good things.

Prayer for the Week

O God, teach us the hidden wisdom of the gospel, so that we may hunger and thirst for holiness, work tirelessly for peace, and be counted among those who seek first the blessedness of your kingdom. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

"Blessed are those who see God in every person and strive to make others also discover him.

"Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home."

"Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort to help others.

"Blessed are those who pray and work for full communion between Christians."


