Liturgical Jottings Eucharistic Prayer part 8 Acclamations 1

The acclamation, by which the whole congregation, joining with the heavenly powers, sings the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy). This acclamation, constitutes part of the Eucharistic Prayer itself, is pronounced by all the people with the Priest. After the Consecration when the priest says, "The mystery of faith", the people pronounce the acclamation, using one of the prescribed formulae. GIRM 79b & 151

After the doxology the congregation ratifies the prayer with its Amen, often called the Great Amen since it follows the Great Thanksgiving.

The Eucharistic Prayer with Children III contains more acclamations: "Glory to God in the highest" during the preface; "Jesus has given his life for us" at the elevations and "We praise you, we bless you, we thank you." Looking at the Readings

The Greatest Commandment of the Law as discerned and taught by Our Lord Jesus is to "Love God ... and our neighbour ...". This teaching is in all four gospels: Matt 22:34-4- (today) Mark 12:28-34, Luke 10 25-37 and John, in another way, 13:31-35. Unlike other gospel parallels these four passages are included in the Sunday readings of the Lectionary. Normally a parallel text in one gospel is not repeated in the three year cycle of Sunday readings, for example, the parable of the Lost Sheep (Luke 15:3-7) on the 24th Sunday in ordinary Time year C is given but Matthew's version (18:12-14) is omitted. The greatest commandment from Mark is read on the 31st Sunday year B; Luke 15th Sunday year C and John on the 5th Sunday of Easter year C.

The reason for its repetition each year should be clearly apparent: it is the greatest commandment; it is important and as Moses taught: "You shall repeat these words always (Deut 6:4-9). The first readings that accompany the gospels on each of these Sundays give an Old Testament teaching of this "new commandment". The passage from Exodus without explicitly stating the law of love, does call the faithful to be kind, patient, caring and just to the stranger, the widow, the orphan and one's neighbour.

The men's choir has restarted on the 1st Sunday of the month. Please come at 8am to practice.


PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL QUESTIONNAIRE
