Liturgical Jottings Liturgy and Christian Life 4 The Word of God and human communications

The unity of word-sacrament as proclaiming and realising the Kingdom of God must always be kept in mind. The Word of God is a gift and requires human effort both from the presenter and the listener if it is to be effectively received. And with Humanity as gift, they are to be recognised, accepted, celebrated and enjoyed in the liturgy and in life.

What we celebrate as the word and truth of God in liturgy must exercise its liberating power and function of the Kingdom of God in the church and in the larger human community. Christians have a duty to promote this true and proper worship. The word of God as a two-edged sword remains a permanent challenge to all genuine human communication in life and in liturgy.

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Looking at the Readings

I remember reading the desperate line in the novel: "One day in the life of Ivan Denisovich" by Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn. It went like this: the day was so cruel I could not wait to evening; the evening was so cold I could not wait for morning. Misery was unrelenting in that Russian labour camp. Similarly Job reflected on his plight: "Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?' Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!' "Undeserved suffering of the innocent is one of the most agonising problems to confront the human mind. There are no ready and definitive answers. The book of Job does confront suffering, drudgery, pessimism. Job's three comforters offer little comfort or wisdom. While there are no simplistic answers we can look to those who have suffered and have endured. Jesus knew suffering, he took on our sufferings and endured injustice, insults and execution. Yet it is by the cross and resurrection we are saved.

The Gospel passage for this Sunday presents: "One day in the life of Jesus Christ." In the morning he was teaching in the synagogue, in the afternoon he was in Peter's house and healed his mother-in-law. In the evening many people came to him with the sick and the possessed whom he cured. Before dawn the next morning Jesus went to a lonely place to pray (Mark 1:29-35).

Jesus skilfully combines prayer to the Father with faithfulness to his mission of proclaiming the Kingdom. One strengthens the other. He created opportunities for both: prayer in the morning long before dawn and ministry of healing that evening, after sunset. We cannot create time but we can create opportunities!
