Liturgical Jottings Easter & Christian Life

The reforms of the Triduum liturgy, prior to the Vatican Council II, reintroduced to the Church a more complete integration of theology and worship. When experienced as a single action of death-resurrectionmission, the paschal mystery promotes a spirituality that is nurtured by resurrection faith, and seeks to make a commitment to the of transformation the world. Resurrection faith speaks a word of hope, connecting human persons with God's future.

Every Christian community is called to discern how God's fidelity to Jesus empowers the baptised to live as the Body of Christ by a fidelity to the poor, the outcast, and those deprived of justice, and human Resurrection dignity. ultimately points the believers to the power of God's Spirit to animate our human potential as co-creators of the reign God's new life in every contemporary history.

Focus on the Gospel

The discovery of the empty tomb – although so simply told – is an astounding event that completes the Paschal Mystery: the passion, death AND resurrection of Jesus. Whilst Christ's willingness to go to his death on the cross was an extraordinary statement of God's love for humankind, it is his rising again from death that offers all Christian people hope. It is the second disciple – the one whom Jesus loved – who is the first to grasp the meaning of what has happened inside the tomb. The gospel tells us that upon entering the tomb and seeing Jesus' burial cloths lying there, 'he saw and he believed'. Unlike the later encounters with the risen Lord, this disciple recognised the truth and significance of what he saw in the empty tomb.

He didn't need to see the risen Lord to believe. Perhaps it is he that we today can best identify with. Not in a position to physically encounter the risen Christ, we are capable of seeing the signs of his resurrection and continuing presence in the world and choose to believe.

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An Easter Poem by Patrice de la Tour du Pin

Light of the world, O Jesus, although we have never seen your open tomb, whence comes this light among us: this feast among feasts, if not from you, the risen one?

When someone we meet says to us: where is your Christ today and his miracle? We respond: whence comes the Spirit that turns us toward his Passover, if not from him?

Our hearts burn when your love descends and whispers to us: Love has come: the day will come in the hearts of all creatures. And the Lord will appear.

And if someone says to us: Now show us a worthy sign beyond ourselves! The sign is that at his return we must do what he loves in order to testify that he is love.

EASTER MESSAGE FROM FR UDAY

Our Lord risen is the Fount of Life. He is the conqueror and victor.

Easter, the celebration of the resurrection of Christ is the greatest testimony of Life. God is life, and our God is a "living" God, the Emmanuel, God-with-us. No power of Satan, no fetters of death, no forces of evil, no closure of tomb, can restrain him from rising, or separate him from living with us.

He lives with us forever, because he is Life and ever alive. His rising assures and comforts us that sin and death have no power over him. Evil seems to have a loud and mocking laugh over good, but that is only short-lived. The Final smile is of God and of good.

Thus the Easter Feast is truly a Victory Day. It is not something peripheral or superficial. It is not just God's victory over Satan, not just Saviour's victory over the Evil one, not just the Holy Spirit's over the evil spirit. It is not a "personal score" that is settled between God and Evil. But something fundamental and foundational, crucial and essential.

The victory of Easter involves the whole creation, the whole of humanity. It touches upon the whole life, the whole person, the whole destiny. It is a comprehensive and holistic victory. It is the victory of all of us. It is the victory of our faith.

Let us become "living temples" and not "empty tombs"! Let us constantly die to sin and rise up from our fallen state, rise up from our dissipation, and live to grace. Let our daily life be a daily resurrection giving us a foretaste of that final resurrection.
