Liturgical Jottings

Preface of Christ the King Pope Pius XI established the feast of Christ the King, (now "the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King") in 1925 to the Sunday before All Saints Day. A newly composed preface was introduced into the Roman Missal in 1928. The feast was moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year in 1969. The Preface (a prayer opening the Eucharistic Prayer) follows the usual pattern, being addressed to the Father in thanksgiving of the marvellous works of creation and redemption and concluding with an invitation to join all the angels in everlasting praise. The main body expresses the Father's anointing of Christ and describes his reign as an eternal and universal kingdom of truth, life, holiness, grace, justice, love and peace.

Looking at the Readings

Jesus response to Pilate's questioning: is: "My Kingdom does not belong to this world" is attested in many ways. Firstly by his next sentence: "His men would not go into battle to rescue him" Violence or coercion has never been his way of teaching. Nor did he practice insidious ways by exploiting people's hopes and dreams of an earthy paradise and power over others. Again he did not sugar-coat his message: there will be times of want and difficulty, his disciples may not be welcomed, there would be persecution and even death. He had to rebuke his apostles who vied for power and position, revenge and superiority.

Jesus reign is to bear witness to the truth, to proclaim the beatitudes as a way of being and life and bring healing, peace and forgiveness, and to be a shepherd and a servant to all, to welcome children, the poor and the sinner. Herod's and Pilate's curiosity was mixed with fear and inability to understand Jesus' mission and life. Jesus' disciples fear and confusion were overcome by faith and understanding and acceptance of love and forgiveness. This feast day readings give us vision of the future and reassurance in the present of Christ as universal Saviour.


The Lorica (the Deer's Cry) St Patrick

MASSES NEXT WEEKEND

Next weekend there will be five Masses in our Parish.

There will be the usual Saturday 6.00pm and Sunday 8.30am Masses in Kyabram for parishioners, as well as three Sacramental Masses (two on the Saturday and one on the Sunday) which are only open to the Sacramental children and a set number of their family.

There will not be a Mass at Merrigum in November.

CHANGES TO VICTORIA'S COVID RESTRICTIONS

As announced by the Victorian Government, from 11.59pm on Thursday 18th November, nearly all remaining Covid restrictions have lifted for fully vaccinated people.

For all weekend Masses at Kyabram, Tongala and Merrigum, all attending must provide evidence of being fully vaccinated or have a certified medical exemption. There will be no limit on numbers and face coverings are no longer required.

Weekday Masses at Kyabram will be open to all and vaccination status will not be checked. However, these Masses will be limited to 50, social distancing is still required and face masks must be worn.

Recording of contact details (by QR code or written) and use of hand sanitiser is still required at all weekend and weekday Masses.


