Liturgical Jottings The Paschal Mystery

Simply stated, the Paschal Mystery is the doctrinal teaching that God saves us from the consequences of sinboth original sin and personal sinsthrough the saving work of Jesus Christ. When we talk about the Paschal (Easter) Mystery we are referring to God's plan of salvation which was ultimately fulfilled through four events in Christ's life. Those four events are His Passion (his suffering and crucifixion), Death, Resurrection, and Ascension.

Pope Francis spoke of the paschal mystery in 2020: "Christian joy flows from listening to, and accepting, the Good News of the death and resurrection of Jesus. This sums up the mystery of a love "so real, so true, so concrete, that it invites us to a relationship of openness and fruitful dialogue" (Christus Vivit, 117). ... [L]ife is born of the love of God our Father, from his desire to grant us life in abundance (cf. Jn 10:10)."

Focus on the Gospel

This passage from the gospel of Luke immediately follows the story of the road to Emmaus and very similar to last week's passage in which Jesus appeared to the gathered disciples. However, what this account gives us, that last week's account from the gospel of John did not, is a powerful message about understanding the scriptures. In the final verses of the passage, Jesus reveals to the disciples that his presence with them is what he'd been talking about when he'd spoken about the fulfilment of the scriptures. And then, 'He opened their minds to understand the scriptures.'

This is an important gospel indication that the scriptures are to be read for understanding and for meaning. It is an imperative that we delve into the scriptures and look for meaning rather than superficial, literal interpretation that is prominent in much of society today. When we only read the scriptures 'literally' i.e. accepting the exact wording as literally true, we deny the depth and breadth of the scriptural messages that are conveyed through image, metaphor, irony and other forms of figurative speech as well as ignoring the rich contextual information that is often hidden within and behind the text. Jesus' enlightenment of the disciples makes plain the importance of 'understanding' scripture not just blindly accepting it. © Greg Sunter
