Liturgical JottingsArs celebrandi 1

One way of caring for and growing in a vital understanding of the symbols of the Liturgy is certainly the "ars celebrandi", the art of celebrating. This expression also is subject to different interpretations. Its sense becomes clear if we refer to the theological sense of the Liturgy described in Vatican Council II, Sacrosanctum Concilium n7, [the Mystery of Christ present and active by means of signs addressed to our senses so that the Spirit might transform every dimension of our life, conforming us more and more to Christ]. The ars celebrandi cannot be reduced to a rubrical mechanism, much less should it be thought of as imaginative creativity without rules. The rite is in itself a norm, and the norm is never an end in itself, but it is always at the service of a higher reality that it means to protect.

Looking at the Readings

'The Day of the Lord is coming' (Mal 3:19) is the opening line of the first reading and the thread woven through all the readings and prayers for this second last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. The Prophet Malachi is brief but complex. The Day of the Lord brings judgement and salvation, it may be a day of great fear or joy. The Readings give the faithful person confidence: "the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays" Mal 3:20; The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice. Ps 97:9; Gospel Acclamation: "Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand." Luke 21:28; Gospel: "Your endurance will win you your lives." Luke 21:19.

We, as a church community, may be weakened by crises and disasters or bewildered by doubts. Malachi calls us to persevere and be confident in the Lord's Coming. Jesus encourages us to be trusting in his presence in times of trial. While the Thessalonians were waiting of the imminent return of Christ, some stopped their daily work, St Paul had to urge them to keep on working, the Lord is coming but not yet.

Each Sunday is the Day of the Lord, Every Eucharist celebrates the Lord who has come, is coming and will come again!

A Grace before Meals

While scripture may be used in our prayer before meals, today's second reading has proven to be unsuitable. Here is an alternative: Lord God, may this food restore our strength, giving new energy to tired limbs, new thoughts to weary minds. May this drink restore our souls, giving new vision to dry spirits, new warmth to cold hearts. And once refreshed, may we give new pleasure to you, who gives us all. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

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
REMEMBERING OUR LOVED ONES DURING NOVEMBER

"Take care not to be deceived", he said 'because many will come using my name and saying.

"I am he", and, "The time is near at hand."

Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

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Breaking Open the Word

THE COMING DAY OF THE LORD

Throughout the centuries people of faith have maintained that the history of the world is in God's hands and that there will come a time when our stewardship of the world will be judged. But when will that day come, and how are we to prepare for it?

Malachi believed that the day would come in his own time. Centuries later the early Church came to believe that it was Jesus who would return as Lord and Judge. Some members of the community in Thessalonika expected that this return would occur at any moment. The problem that arose was that these Christians expected others to support them while they waited for the Lord's return. To counteract this Paul draws their attention to his own practice of working wherever he preaches the Gospel. Such people are advised to follow his example and quietly return to their daily routine and Christian life not burdening others.

The passing of time has borne witness to the wisdom of Paul's advice to the Thessalonians. Jesus had not yet appeared, and this gave rise to another set of questions. Jesus had spoken of the signs that would precede his return. Luke's community late in the first century found themselves asking whether the turmoil and persecution of their own time were to be understood as signs that the Lord's return was imminent. The response they are given is that the difficulties of this present time are an opportunity to give faithful and courageous witness. Two thousand years later this challenge is an enduring one for us all.
