## Liturgical Jottings Lent - 1

Lent begins next Wednesday. It is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others. In this way the whole church prepares for Easter with those who are to be baptised. Other celebrations in Lent (e.g. Marriage) must take into account of the spirit of penance: musical instruments are only used to sustain singing and floral decorations are very simple.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting binding those who are between 18 and 60. The law of abstinence (from eating meat) binds those who are 14 and over (CCL 97, 1251f).

In Lent the Alleluia is omitted at Mass and Liturgy of the Hours, even in celebrations of solemnities and feast. A homily is recommend-ed on weekdays especially during the Seasons of Advent, Lent and Easter. (Aust & NZ Ordo 2024 pp 37,38)

## **Looking at the Readings**

The Book of Leviticus goes into great detail about identifying, treating, and isolating persons with leprosy and other like complaints. Chapter 13 has 59 verses and in Chapter 14 on purification of lepers has 57 verses. We read a small section today (five verses). Nonetheless lepers suffer physically and socially. The disease in ancient times was also considered a punishment for sins (with religious minded peoples) or retribution for evils committed (with the general populace). We may ask the question today: "Have we shifted our understandings of suffering, adversities and atrocities with wars, pandemics and natural disasters?" When these things happen there are suggestions of divine retribution, lingering accusations and blame upon certain people or social groups.

Early in his ministry Jesus is confronted with people with diseases and the questions: "Whose fault? What sins have brought this on? Is it the sufferers or their parents that caused this?" He responds typically with: It is nobody's fault but the glory of God can be seen in the healing. And in his compassion for the accused, the victim, or the isolated person, Jesus healed them. The healer then gets accused of blasphemy or breaking the Sabbath or receives ridicule or becomes the isolated person. Jesus, our Saviour takes on our sins so that we are saved from them!

## Leprosy (Hansen's Disease) today

Leprosy is a chronic bacterial infection. It affects the skin and various nervous systems of the body, particularly the peripheral nerves. Leprosy is more common in tropical and subtropical areas. The disease is curable through multi-drug therapy. (*VicHealth*)
